SNOQUALMIE POPULATION: 9,851

Snoqualmie Falls, the 268-foot waterfall so stunning it practically brings highway traffic to a halt, may be the money shot, but the real payoff in this onetime sawmill town resides on Railroad Avenue, a mile away. That's where you'll find Isadora's

Cafe—a local crafts purveyor, cafe, and gossip hub all rolled into one. Across the street sits the former train depot (built in 1890) turned train treasury, the Northwest Railway Museum. The steam engines on display are fun to look at, but

for the whole Casey Jones experience opt for the museum's four-mile rail ride to the town of North Bend and back. The view out the train window will look familiar. David Lynch filmed his creepy *Twin Peaks* TV series in the area, which

included, of course, that cascading money shot.
